

VX ONE REGATTA GUIDELINES

A guide to regatta organisers and race officers in creating and executing VX One class *racing*.

Race Management

- (A) For one-design class events races shall not be *started* when the median wind speed is below 4 knots or exceeds 26 knots. It will remain at the discretion of the *PRO* to abandon a race when any of these conditions persist. Sailing instructions may alter these limits.
- (B) If after the *start*, the median wind speed falls below 4 kts or exceeds 26 kts for a period of 15 minutes, it is recommended for the *PRO* to abandon *racing*.
- (C) Set mark races should consist of approximately equal upwind and downwind distances.
- (D) If a time limit is deemed necessary, the time limit after the first **boat** finishes should be 30 minutes.
- (E) The Race Committee is encouraged to use VHF radios to communicate with the fleet and individual competitors.
- (F) Competitors are encouraged to select a VX One competitor to serve as a VX One fleet liaison with the racecourse *PRO*.

Scoring

- (A) For short series scoring the Low Point Scoring system of the RRS Appendix A is recommended.
- (B) Three completed races may constitute a series.
- (C) When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score may be the total of her race scores.
- (D) When six or more races have been completed, a boat's series score may be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- (E) For long series scoring the High-Point Percentage Scoring System in the US Sailing Prescriptions to the RRS (2017–2020) Appendix A is recommended.

Bow Numbers

- (A) Use of VXCA bow numbers which reference the **hull** and **sail** number are encouraged.
